# REPORT OF THE $8^{TH}$ ANCAP SYMPOSIUM HELD AT THE DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY, MAKERERE UNIVERSITY KAMPALA, UGANDA ON $31^{ST}$ JULY 2015

The symposium was conducted on the last day of the 11th ANCAP summer school (31<sup>st</sup> July 2015) and it was a **special research forum** in memory of the Late Prof. Michael Kishimba (University of Dar es Salaam, Tanzania) and Prof. Bernard Kiremire (Makerere University, Uganda). Professors Kishimba and Kiremire were among the founders of ANCAP. During the session postgraduate students had the opportunity to present their research activities and findings in a forum in honour of the late professors for their enormous contributions in the fields of pesticides analysis and prosperity of ANCAP.

The symposium included 32 participants from Ethiopia, Kenya, Rwanda, Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, and Zimbabwe.

An inspiring key note speech titled "Celebrating the Lives and Times of Prof. Kiremire and Prof. Kishimba" was presented by Prof. Wandiga. A total of eleven papers were presented and discussed during the symposium. The papers covered different aspects of chemistry research conducted in the respective countries including environmental assessment of the pesticides, persistent organic pollutants and other organic contaminants (e.g. analysis of residues, degradation studies, and modelling), heavy metals, organic synthesis, green chemistry, and material chemistry. Each forum presentation was given 15 min followed by 5 min of questions and comments. The presentations were evaluated by a team of five judges that comprised experts from the University of Florida, University of Dar es Salaam and Makerere University.

The first three winners were awarded prizes by Prof. Nkedi-Kizza as follows:

- 1. Ms. Ruth Mbabazi (Uganda)-First Winner (Best): US Dollars 250, plus a certificate of recognition.
- 2. Mr. Pamhidzai Dzomba (Zimbabwe)-Second Winner: US Dollars 150, plus a certificate of recognition.
- 3. Ms. Maurine A. Otieno (Kenya)-Third Winner: US Dollars 100, plus a certificate of recognition.

The symposium was crowned by award of certificates of participation in the workshop, certificates of appreciation to the sponsors (ANCAP and Prof. Nkedi-Kizza) and a farewell party to the participants.
